Table Topper

"Maple Leaves Falling on the Table"

Quilted Table Topper

This scrappy quilted project is quick to put together - and it will bring beautiful fall colors to your table top!

Fabric requirements include all fabric for the project top, back and binding.

Finished Table Topper is 24" Square

Finished Blocks are 10" square

Unfinished Blocks are 10 1/2" square

All seams are 1/4"

Press in the direction of the arrows.

Fabric Requirements	Amount
White or Beige	1/2 yard of scrappy fabric
Beige (print)	1/8 yard of scrappy fabric
Green	3/8 yard of scrappy fabrics
Orange	1/2 yard of scrappy fabrics
Batting	26" square
Backing	26" square*

*The batting and backing are a few inches bigger than the table topper, but is necessary if you are going to hand-quilt the quilt or machine the table topper (domestic or longarm) it.



This quilt is made using the chain piecing method. If you cut out all of your fabrics first, then sew them together in chains, you can complete this quilted table topper very quickly!

Fabric for Green Block	Cutting Instructions - These cutting instructions are for ONE (1) block. You will need TWO (2) Green blocks for this quilt project.
Green	Cut ONE (1) 3 3/4" square
Green	Cut ONE (1) 3 3/4" x 7" strip
Green	Cut TWO (2) 4 3/8" squares
Background	Cut TWO (2) 3 3/4" squares
Background	Cut TWO (2) 4 3/8" squares - then on the back of these squares, draw a diagonal line, corner-to-corner, ONE (1) time on each square

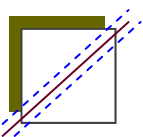

Fabric for Green Square	Cutting Instructions - These cutting instructions are for ONE (1) block. You will need TWO (2) Orange blocks for this quilt project.
Orange	Cut ONE (1) 3 3/4" square
Orange	Cut ONE (1) 3 3/4" x 7" strip
Orange	Cut TWO (2) 4 3/8" squares
Background	Cut TWO (2) 3 3/4" squares
Background	Cut TWO (2) 4 3/8" squares - then on the back of these squares, draw a diagonal line, corner-to-corner, ONE (1) time on each square

Piecing the Blocks: Note: The instructions are for the Green blocks. The Orange blocks are made in the exact same manner so just substitute the Orange fabrics to complete the TWO (2) Orange blocks..

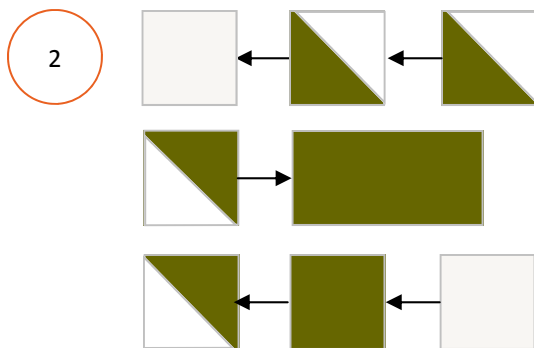
Place the 4 3/8" WHITE square on the 4 3/8" GREEN square (right sides together) and sew 1/4" on EACH side of the line you drew. Then, cut the half-square triangles apart ON the line you drew. You will end up with TWO (2) half-square triangles per set of WHITE/GREEN squares. Press toward the darkest fabric.

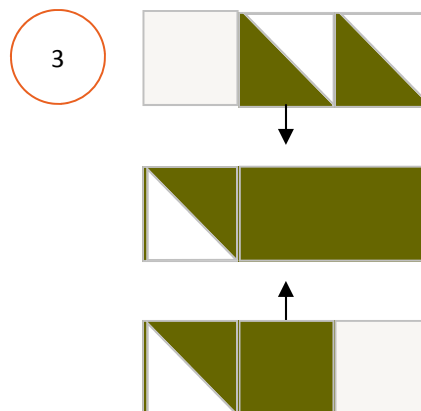
Alternative Method: Instead of making 4 3/8" squares, cut 4 3/4" squares and once you have the half square triangles completed, square up the half square triangles so they are 3 3/4" square.



Continue with the chain piecing method to sew the blocks together.

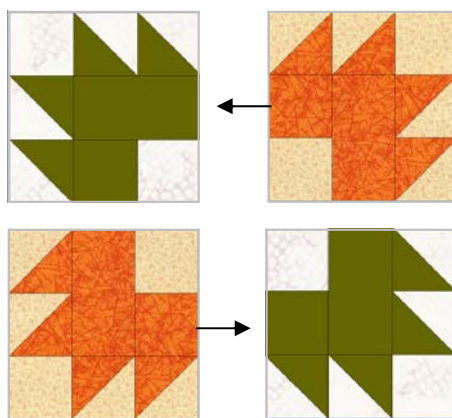

Finishing the Table Runner Top

Fabric Cuts for Border and Binding

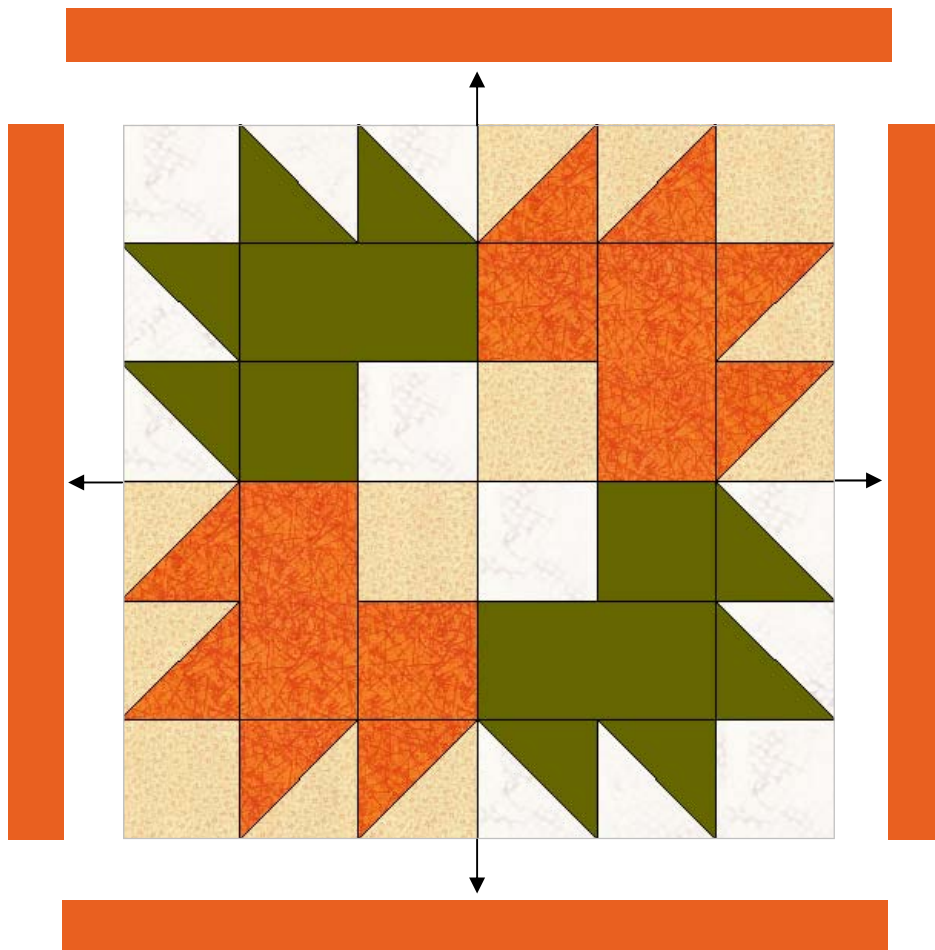
Orange (Border)	Using fabric scraps, cut TWO (2) 2 1/2" x 20" strips (left & right Borders)
Orange (Border)	Using fabric scraps, cut TWO (2) 2 1/4" x 24" strips (top & bottom Borders)
Green (Binding)	Cut and piece enough scrap fabrics to create a 2" wide fabric strip for binding



This pattern has been tested, to the best of our ability. If your block does not come out the size shown, please try adjusting your needle position to the appropriate position (left or right) and see if you get the correct block size.

Congratulations! Now it's time for you to create your quilt sandwich, quilt your table runner then add the binding!
