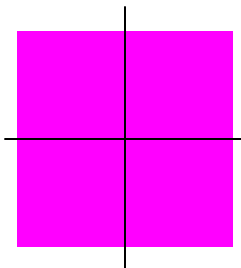
Because you should have 31 fat quarters, we are leaving the color selections up to you. We will give you instructions for the fabric cuts based on general colors in this fabric line. Please be creative and have FUN!

"Santorini" Block #5



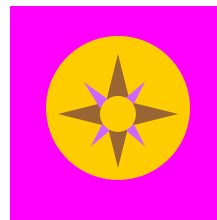
Fabric	Cut (most of the cuts on this quilt are made with a pinking rotary blade. You may use your own judgment as to how you want to cut your fabrics)
Pink	ONE (1) 15" square
Yellow	ONE (1) 9" circle
Brown	FOUR (4) Template #1
Purple	FOUR (4) Template #2
Pink	ONE (1) 2" circle

Use your iron to press your square in half twice, so you can center the design on the square.

Place your template pieces on the pressed lines and center as shown (centers touching), and sew into place with a straight stitch 1/4" (on the template piece) from the edge.

Press your block to remove the pressed lines and you're done!

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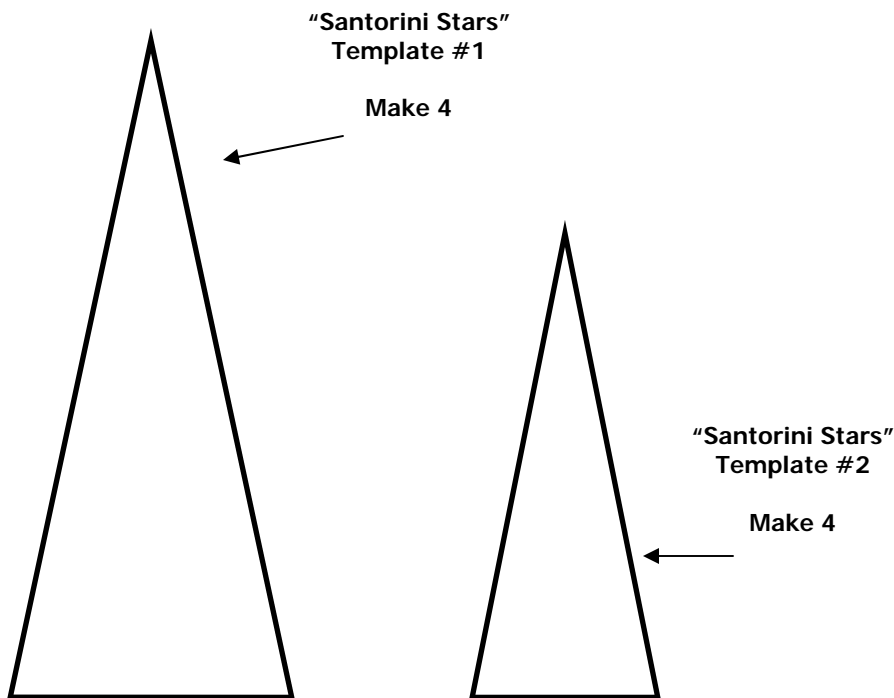
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"Santorini" Block #5 Template



Cut FOUR (4) of EACH of these templates. If you want to use fusible web, cut that first and press it to the back of your fabric, trace the shape and then cut out of your fabric.
