**All Seams 1/4”
Finished Quilt = 66” x 83”
Finished Block for Quilt = 15”
Unfinished Block for Quilt = 15 1/2”**

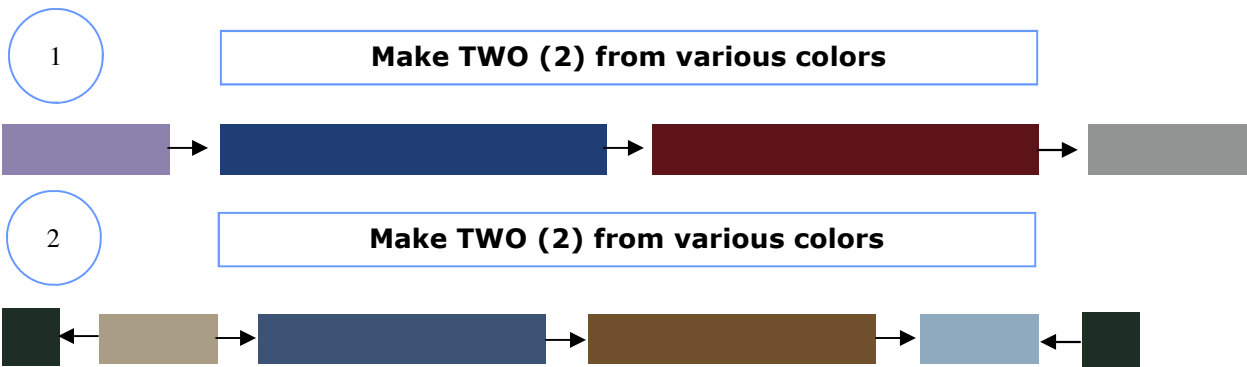
Cutting for Completing Your “Pendleton Inspired” BOM Quilt	
Sashing Fabric	Cut EIGHT (8) 2 1/2” x 15 1/2” strips
Sashing Fabric	Cut and piece THREE (3) 2 1/2” x 49 1/2” strips
Border #1 Fabric	Cut and piece TWO (2) 2 1/2” x 66 1/2” strips for left and right Border #1
Border #1 Fabric	Cut and piece Two (2) 2 1/2” x 53 1/2” strips for top and bottom Border #1
Border #2 Fabrics	Cut FOUR (4) 3 1/2” x 25” strips from the fabric leftovers for left and right Border #2
Border #2 Fabrics	Cut FOUR (4) 3 1/2” x 11” strips from the fabric leftovers for the left and right Border #2
Border #2 Fabrics	Cut FOUR (4) 3 1/2” x 18” strips from the fabric leftovers for top and bottom Border #2
Border #2 Fabrics	Cut FOUR (4) 3 1/2” x 9 1/2” strips from the fabric leftovers for the top and bottom Border #2
Border #2 Fabric	Cut FOUR (4) 3 1/2” squares for Border #2 corners
Border #3 Fabric	Cut and piece TWO (2) 3 1/2” x 76 1/2” for left and right Border #3
Border #3 Fabric	Cut and piece TWO (2) 3 1/2” x 65 1/2” for top and bottom Border #3
Binding	Cut and piece enough 2 1/2” x WOF strips to bind your quilt

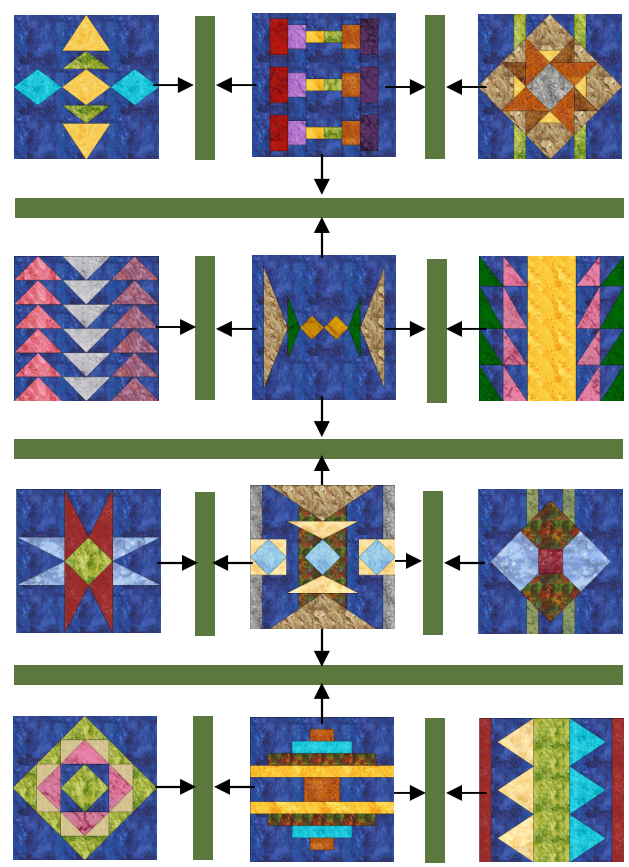
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Putting Your “Pendleton Inspired” Quilt Top Together (you may put the blocks in any order you’d prefer):



Sew the sashing strips between the blocks first to create your rows, then sew the rows together with the longer sashing strips.



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Now sew each border, one at a time, to your quilt top. Always sew the left and right borders on first, then the top and bottom borders. Press ALL seams toward the borders.
