Fabric Requirements



Charm Square Pack

There is enough fabric in ONE (1) Charm Square Pack to make all six gift card holders. You will also need the following:

- 1/4 yard Peltex®
- 1/4 yard fusible web
- OR 1/4 yard fusible Peltex®
- Embroidery floss for ties
- Buttons to hold string ties

This pattern has been tested, to the best of our ability. If your block does not come out the size shown, please try adjusting your needle position to the appropriate position (left or right) and see if you get the correct block size.

For every gift card holder, you will need a front and a back, fused to the Peltex (or you can purchase the fusible Peltex) as well as another charm square to use as the pocket. A couple of the designs have additional scraps of fabric sewn to the pocket material, to create a more authentic look.

Remember, a gift card is about 2 1/8" x 3 3/8" - so, you must be sure to make sure your pocket will be large enough to accommodate that card size.

We don't want to tell you what fabrics to use where, so please use your discretion and enjoy your artistic choices with the fabrics. Last, but certainly not least, have FUN making and gifting these projects!



Basic Piecing Instructions

- 1) Cut out template and trace onto your Peltex as well as TWO (2) times onto your fusible web. Please remember that if your template isn't perfectly shaped (example: the stocking), you'll need to trace one shape in one direction and one shape in the opposite direction.
- 2) Press the fusible web to the charm squares you've chosen for the front and the back of the Peltex.
- 3) Using the template, now cut it out one more time, with the fabric you would like to use for the pocket.
- 4) Fold the pocket fabric down, until you have about 1" of the front of the shape showing (or enough so that a gift card will fit into the pocket) and press the fold in place. Then, sew a decorative stitch across this fold, to hold it in place.
- 5) Pin the pocket fabric to your completed Peltex-covered shape, and then using a close zig-zag stitch, stitch all the way around the edges of the shape.
- 6) Attach a button to the top center of your card holder, using embroidery floss to secure it, and to create a loop, and tie with a knot on the back (holding the button in place) and again at the top (creating the loop).
- 7) Fill it with a gift card (or money) and hang it on the tree!





Christmas Tree




