"Christmas Tree Joy" Table Runner

A very quick project for a beginner quilter and beyond. Make your table beautiful with the gorgeous "Joy Batik" Christmas fabric.
Fabric requirements include all fabric for the project top, back and binding. Finished Table Runner is 14 1/2" x 29 1/2"
All seams are 1/4". Press in the direction of the arrows.

Fabric Requirements	Amount	
Green	3/8 yard (includes Border)	
Red Snowflakes	1/4 yard (includes Binding)	
Cream/Gold Snowflakes	1/4 yard	
Cream	1/4 yard	
Gold	5" square	
Backing Fabric	1/2 yard	
Fusible Web (optional)	5″ square	



This pattern has been tested, to the best of our ability. If your block does not come out the size shown, please try adjusting your needle position to the appropriate position (left or right) and see if you get the correct block size.



Fabric	Cutting Instructions for the "Christmas Tree Joy" Table Runner
Green	Cut TWO (2) 1 1/2" x 2 1/8" strips
Green	Cut TWO (2) 1 1/2" x 3 7/8" strips
Green	Cut TWO (2) 1 1/2" x 5 1/2" strips
Green	Cut TWO (2) 1 1/2" x 7 1/8" strips
Green	Cut TWO (2) 1 1/2" x 8 7/8" strips
Cream	Cut FOUR (4) 1 1/2" x 1 3/8" strips
Cream	Cut FOUR (4) 1 1/2" x 2 1/8" strips
Cream	Cut FOUR (4) 1 1/2" x 3" strips
Cream	Cut FOUR (4) 1 1/2" x 3 7/8" strips
Cream	Cut EIGHT (8) 1 1/2" x 4 5/8" strips
Cream	Cut ONE (1) 4 1/2" x 10 1/2" strip
Red Snowflakes	Cut TWO (2) 1 1/2" x 10 1/2" strips
Red Snowflakes	Cut TWO (2) 1 1/2" x 2 1/8" strips
Cream/Gold Snowflakes	Cut TWO (2) 1 1/2" x 10 1/2" strips
Cream/Gold Snowflakes	Cut TWO (2) 2 5/8" x 10 1/2" strips
Gold	Cut TWO (2) stars out of the attached template
Fusible Web (optional)	Cut TWO (2) stars out of the attached template
Green	Cut TWO (2) 2 1/2" x 25 1/2" strips (left and right Border)
Green	Cut TWO (2) 2 $1/2'' \times 14 1/2''$ strips (top and bottom Border)
Red Snowflakes	Cut and piece enough 2" x WOF strips to bind your table runner


This table runner goes together very fast, if you have your fabric cut out and you use the chain piecing method. If you are unfamiliar with chain piecing, please refer to your preferred search engine for a tutorial, description and/or video.

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First sew the individual Christmas trees together first, then sew the rest of the block together.




This designer chose to applique the stars to the Christmas tree tops **after** sewing the table runner block together. If you prefer to applique the stars with a smaller work surface, just sew the tree tops together with the center fabric and add your stars, then complete the Christmas tree block.

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




Congratulations! Now it's time for you to create your quilt sandwich, quilt your table runner and add the binding!

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The star templates are appliquéd to the top of each Christmas Tree on your table runner. If you prefer to use fusible web to attach them to your trees, use a blanket stitch on your sewing machine with red thread to further adhere them to your table runner. If you prefer to use raw edge appliqué, use red thread to secure the stars. If you prefer to use the needle turned method, please add your seam allowance to the templates above.

The key is to use *some* type of red thread to make your stars SHINE on top of your trees!

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
