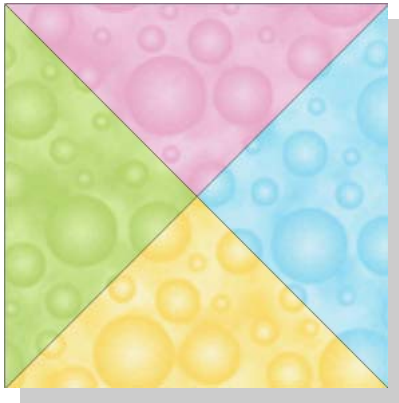
Cutting Instructions For Block 6

You will need to make FIFTEEN (15) of these blocks for the quilt.
 These cutting instructions are for ONE (1) block.

Fabric	Cut
A (yellow bubbles)	Cut ONE (1) 14 1/2" square, then cut the square diagonally, corner to corner TWO (2) times, ending with FOUR (4) triangles. You just need ONE (1) of these triangles to make this block.
B (green bubbles)	Cut ONE (1) 14 1/2" square, then cut the square diagonally, corner to corner TWO (2) times, ending with FOUR (4) triangles. You just need ONE (1) of these triangles to make this block.
C (pink bubbles)	Cut ONE (1) 14 1/2" square, then cut the square diagonally, corner to corner TWO (2) times, ending with FOUR (4) triangles. You just need ONE (1) of these triangles to make this block.
D (blue bubbles)	Cut ONE (1) 14 1/2" square, then cut the square diagonally, corner to corner TWO (2) times, ending with FOUR (4) triangles. You just need ONE (1) of these triangles to make this block.

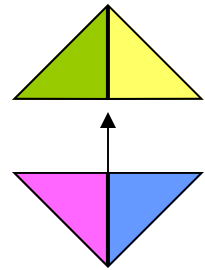
Sewing Instructions For Block 6

Seam Allowance = 1/4"

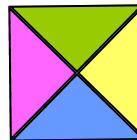
- 1) This is the simplest block we've made thus far! Sew your Fabric A triangle to your Fabric B triangle ... and your Fabric C triangle to your Fabric D triangle. Press towards the darker fabrics (B & D):



- 2) Now, sew these two sets of triangle pieces to each other, pressing in either direction:

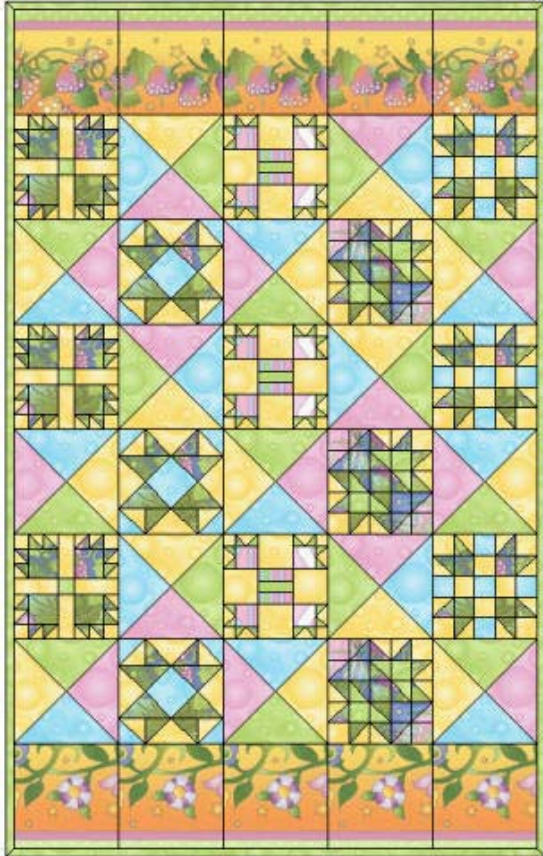

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**February 27, 2007 -
Putting it All Together**

Seam Allowance = 1/4"

Your top and bottom borders are 13 1/2" squares cut from Fabric J. The binding is 2 1/2" strips of Fabric B (green bubbles), cut and pieced together to the appropriate length to circle the quilt.

Lay out your quilt so that it follows the image here, and sew the blocks into rows and then sew the rows together. Be sure to watch for placement of your final 4 X blocks - rotate them until you get the desired pattern shown above. Once your top is pieced, create your quilt sandwich (with batting and backing) and quilt your top! Then, add the binding.
