



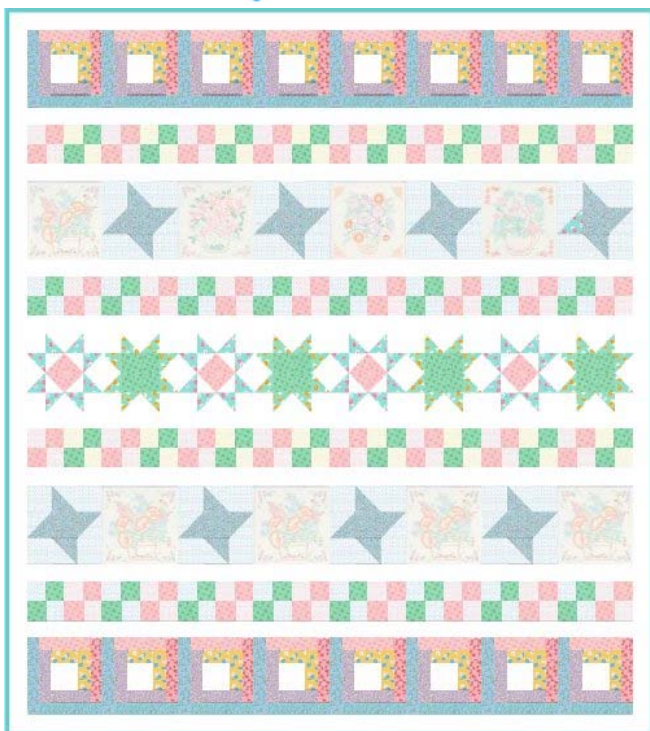
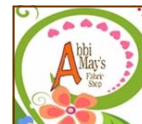

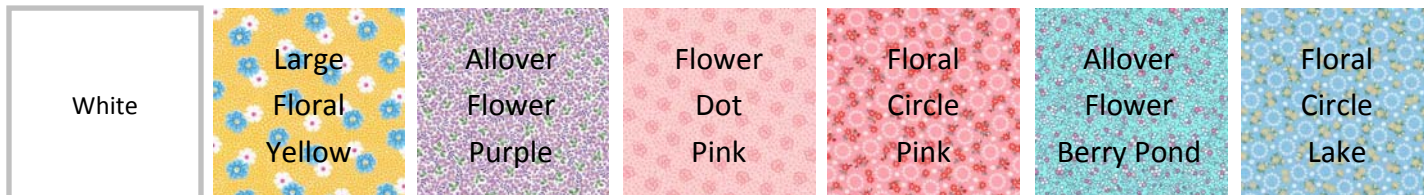

All Seams a scant 1/4"

Read ALL Instructions Before Beginning

Row #1 & #9 Fabrics



 **Aurifil thread suggestions:**
 #1135, #2410, #2415, #5006 & #2309



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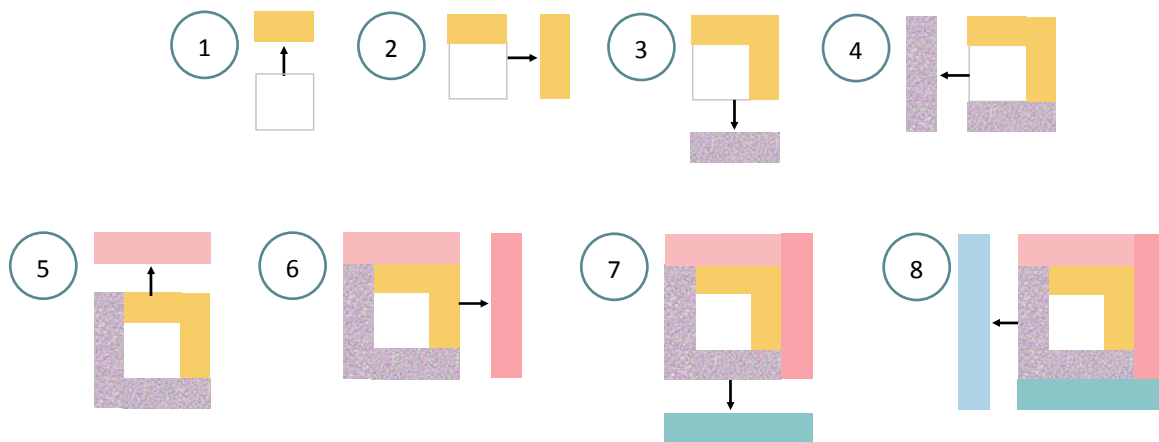
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Row #9 Fabric Cuts - Repeat the SAME fabric cuts as you did in the Row #1 instructions. You are making a total of **SIXTEEN (16)** Log Cabin Quilt Blocks - **EIGHT (8)** in Row #1 and **EIGHT (8)** in Row #9. These blocks go together quickly if you chain-stitch them. Just be sure to backstitch at the beginning and ending of each fabric you add. Press in the direction of the arrows.



Make **SIXTEEN (16)** of these blocks.

Please Note: If you purchased the fabric kit for this quilt, you need to save your scraps as some of them you will need to piece together to complete Rows #1 & #9. When piecing your scraps together, use a $\frac{3}{8}$ " seam allowance and press your seams **OPEN**. This will make the seams “seemingly” impossible to see.
