

Finished quilt = 75" x 84" Finished Blocks for Quilt = 9" Unfinished Blocks for Quilt = 9 1/2"

Purchase Aurifil Thread from Aurifil

All seams a scant 1/4". Press in the direction of the arrows.

Read ALL Instructions Before Beginning

Part Two for Rows #3 & #7

If you purchased the quilt kit from www.AbbiMays.com, it came with a panel with EIGHT (8) 9 1/2" quilt blocks featuring different flowers, leaves and planters. Before cutting them out, use a crayon, fabric pen or fabric marker to color each block, then heat set each one of them. If you are not familiar with heat setting, set your iron on its hottest setting (cotton) and <u>do not</u> use steam. Cover a block with a paper towel and press the paper towel, making sure you are pressing and not moving your iron back and forth. Do this for each block, one paper towel per block. Now you can cut out your blocks out at 9 1/2" square. After the initial heat setting, you don't have to worry about the crayon or markers running or bleeding, just iron them as you would any other quilt fabric. Finally, you can sew rows #3 & #7 together!

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
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If you did <u>not</u> purchase the quilt kit and are using fabrics you purchased or fabrics from your stash, you have innumerable choices for replacing the panels with quilt blocks of your choosing! You can use different colored fabrics and make EIGHT (8) additional "Friendship Star" quilt blocks as in the previous instructions (pressing in the opposite directions) or you can just start quilt block surfing to see if you can find a complimentary 9 1/2" unfinished quilt block to make to finish off these two rows of this quilt.
