I Believe in a Card Holder


Fabric requirements include all fabric for the project top and binding. This is a two-part project, if you purchase the kit. Finished Quilt is 18" x 20". All seams are 1/4".



Fabric	Cuts
Fabric Panel	Cut THREE (3) of the fabric panel images circled above (be careful, you want to use other parts of the panel for next week's project)
Sparkle Stripe Loden	Cut THREE (3) pieces the same size as the THREE (3) Fabric Panel strips (the two lower ones above are a different size than the upper one)
Snow Berries Garnet	Just square up your 3/4 yard of fabric, you will square it up again before you're finished
Ribbon (not included in kit)	Cut THREE (3) 5" strips
Temtex [®] or Peltex [®] (not included in kit)	Cut ONE (1) piece to-size, based on the 3/4 yard Snow Berries Garnet fabric



With your fabric panel, sew the Stripe fabric to it, right sides together, across the top and down both of the sides. Make THREE (3).



Turn the pockets right-side out and push out the corners. Press the seams and use a pinking cutter to square up the bottom. Make THREE (3).



Now, top-stitch 1/8" from the edge of the TOP of the pockets. Make THREE (3).

This pattern has been tested, to the best of our ability. If your block does not come out the size shown, please try adjusting your needle position to the appropriate position (left or right) and see if you get the correct block size.

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
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Use your Temtex or Peltex to create a layer with your Berries fabric. Draw your quilt lines and quilt on the lines with a cross-hatch pattern. Pin together the layers and quilt on the lines you drew. You can also run a running stitch all around the perimeter, 1/2" from the edge,.



Finally, measure well and pin your ribbons to the top of the card holder, to use with a dowel rod for hanging your project up. To secure, run another running stitch 1/8" inside the line you already sewed.

Now, square up the size of the card holder backing to 18" x 22" with a pinking-rotary blade. Then, measure the placement for your pockets and pin to the backing, as shown, and then sew the sides and bottom to your background fabric.



I Believe in a Card Holder is a two-part Quilt Project. Save the panel scraps and stay tuned for next week's project using the remaining panel.
