




Fabric requirements include all fabric for the project top and binding.

Finished Quilt is 73" square
All seams are 1/4"
Press in the direction of the arrows.

Finished Blocks: 8" square Unfinished Blocks: 8 1/2" square

Fabric	Amount
Green	2 1/4 yards (includes border)
Tan	1 yard (includes border squares and binding)
Blue	3 yards



Block #1 Tree Top

Cutting for the Quilt—Block 1: These instructions are for ONE (1) block. You need to make FOUR (4) of these blocks for the quilt.

Fabric	Cuts
Green	Cut ONE (1) 5" square
Blue	Cut ONE (1) 5" square—then draw a diagonal line, corner -to-corner, ONE (1) time on the back of the square.
Blue	Cut ONE (1) 4 1/2" x 8 1/2" strip






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


Tree Top




Make TWO (2)

Place the Blue 5" square on the Green 5" fabric square and sew 1/4" on EACH side of the line you drew. Then, cut the half-square triangles apart ON the line you drew. Finally, take your finished half-square triangles and trim them so they are 4 1/2" x 8 1/2". You will end up with TWO (2) half-square triangles for each pair of squares you sew together. Press toward the darkest fabric.




Block #2 Tree Bottom

Cutting for the Quilt—Block 2: These instructions are for ONE (1) block. You need to make FOUR (4) of these blocks for the quilt.		
Fabric	Cuts	
Tan	Cut ONE (1) 4 1/2" x 8 1/2" strips	

Tan Cut ONE (1) 4 1/2" x 8 1/2" strips

Blue Cut ONE (1) 4 1/2" x 8 1/2" strips






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Cutting for the Quilt—Block 3: These instructions are for ONE (1) block. You need to make TWELVE (12) of these blocks for the quilt.		
Fabric	Cuts	

Fabric	Cuts
Green	Cut ONE (1) 9" square.
	Cut ONE (1) 9" square. Then draw a diagonal line, corner-to-corner, ONE (1) time on the back of the square.

Block #3 Tree Top





Make SIX (6) because each square makes TWO (2) half-square triangles.

Place the Blue 10" square on the Green 10" fabric square and sew 1/4" on EACH side of the line you drew. Then, cut the half-square triangles apart ON the line you drew. Finally, take your finished half-square triangles and trim them so they are 8 1/2" square. You will end up with TWO (2) half-square triangles for each pair of squares you sew together. Press half of the half-square triangles toward the Blue fabric and half of the half-square triangles toward the Green fabric.

Final Fabric Cuts for the Quilt:		
Fabric	Cuts	
Green	Cut TEN (10) 8 1/2" squares	
Blue	Cut THIRTY-FOUR (34) 8 1/2" squares	
Tan (for border)	Cut EIGHT (8) 4 1/2" squares	
Green (for border)	Cut EIGHT (8) 4 1/2" x 30 1/2" strips	
Tan (binding)	Cut and piece together enough 2 $1/2^{\prime\prime}$ x WOF strips to create the binding for your quilt	






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Using the image below, sew your blocks together in rows and then sew the rows together. Finally, add the border to your quilt top.
